The Problem:

Recently retired from working as a Sales Manager in the grocery industry, Scott wanted to replicate his office setup at home, as so he could make use of a large screen monitor.

Background:

Having recently upgraded his Dell Studio Laptop from Windows 7 to Windows 10 Scott needed a docking station that could support both his Dell and his Sony Vaio laptop.

Scott first started using a Universal USB 3.0 dock after observing a customer using one to hook up their laptop to a larger screen to better manage multiple files and applications.

The Solution:

Scott consulted Kensington’s technical support team and elected to invest in the SD4000. The SD4000 can connect two additional screens to one of Scott’s laptops or can be used to connect either of his laptops to a 4K monitor.

How it Works

2K for Dual Monitors

Ideal for users not ready to make the transition to 4K, this option can support the typical two-monitor setup with 1920x1200/2048x1152 resolution for each screen.

HDMI or DisplayPort Options for 4K

Both connections are available on the back of the dock and can be accessed through a sliding panel that covers the connection port you’re not using.
